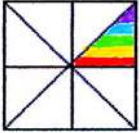
Definition: Different approaches to psychological and physiological responses that are called emotions which are often characterised by strong feelings, tension, or excitement.

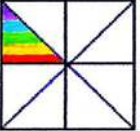

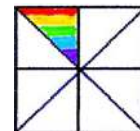

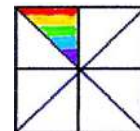
In terms of emotions, fulfillment is a happy, contented feeling. People often feel fulfillment when something is completed, whether it's a goal or a dream that you've been waiting on.

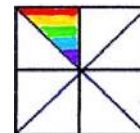

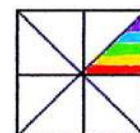
Definition: Unrecognised or overlooked patterns/structures of reality, caused by a restrained ontological outlook.
